Form 19b-4 Information

Partial Amendment No. 3 of CHX-2004-38

The Chicago Stock Exchange (the “CHX” or the “Exchange”) seeks to amend this filing to state:

1. Through this proposal, the Exchange is requiring its participants to provide specific data to the Exchange. The proposed rules specifically provide that the obligation to provide data does not “apply to orders sent or received through . . . any [other] electronic systems that the Exchange expressly recognizes as providing the required information in a format acceptable to the Exchange.” In connection with this rule change, the Exchange is completing changes to its existing Brokerplex® system, so that that system can be used by CHX floor brokers and market makers to record all required order details. As a result, the Exchange’s on-floor participants will not be required to develop their own data-recording systems in response to this rule. Although, at this time, Exchange’s systems are the only systems recognized by the Exchange for the collection and recording of the required information, Exchange participants ultimately could develop their own systems for collecting and recording that information, so long as the systems provide the data in a format acceptable to the Exchange.
2. The Exchange makes its Brokerplex system available to all floor participants who request the system and pay any applicable fees.
3. As noted above, the Exchange is making changes to its existing Brokerplex system to permit this rule proposal to be implemented.
